ABOUT WAAPO

Women Action for Advocacy and Progress (WAAPO) is a Somaliland-based nongovernmental organization founded by women in 1997. WAAPO's works to protect and support women, youth, and children by providing practical and emotional support, protection, economic empowerment, and education, as well as campaigning for long-term change in their lives. WAAPO is one of the most well-known local non-governmental organizations (NGOs) in Somaliland for its work in the areas of protection, livelihood and Youth innovation. WAAPO manages the only safe house that exists in Somaliland.

WAAPO is actively involved in the fields of gender equality, advocacy and human rights, including Women, Youth, and Children rights, Gender-based violence and child protection, social economic empowerment, livelihood development and youth education, general protection.

About the Project:

WAAPO is currently implementing four intervention program funding by UNICFE incl, Community care, Children on the move (Safe house and CP Desks) and Upshift project, to provide protection services for SGBV girls and women survivors through the Community Care approach, strengthening the referral system for survivors of SGBV, transitional shelter support and empowerment of children with disabilities to promote self-reliance and

independence through social reintegration. SGBV cases will continue to be referred to 3 shelters established in Borama, Burao and Hargeisa for counselling, transitional shelter provision and medical support. Through a network of Child Protection Desks, WAAPO will strengthen the referral process for child survivors needing medical, legal assistance and reunification with families

The integrated emergency response program for drought-affected communities, including Lascanod conflict, is a six-month from (march to august) emergence response program financed by UNICEF. The project targeted four regions, including Sool (incl. Lascanod), Sanag, Togdheer, and Marodijeex. The program consists of child protection in emerging, SBC, Wash, and GBV for the most vulnerable people which was afflicted by conflict, climate change, and drought.

2 Child Protection In Emergence

2.1 GBV & CP In Emergence prevention and responses

- Established 4 protection desk in drought/Conflict affected areas incl. Kalabaydh& Buhudle. & deployed -frontline workers dedicate to provide case management service and referral.
- A total 66 (41F; 24 M) vulnerable women displaced from the drought & conflict supported Start-Up business grants and training incl. Buhudle & Kalabaydh district.
- 320 vulnerable women received NFIs & dignity kits; & A total 420 vulnerable women accessed one-time emergence cash assistance for emergency referral support.
- A total of 10210 individuals were also received quality service through case management service incl. PSS and referrals.
- A total of 7780 persons (2420F, 2240M, 1440B, 1680G) were reached though GBV In emergence awareness raising, prevention activities & capacity building.
- Established of (12) community based committees/ groups working on SGBV /CP –In emergence.
- A total 1410 Persons (720 Girls; 690 Boys) has been attended youth talk vie student roundtable (Hero –in me school clubs) on issue around social norm, SRHR, hygiene practice, and FGM/C and early marriage,
- Conducted; Evidence based research on GBV/CP-In emergence particularly conflict areas inc. Buhudle and Kalabaydh.

Main Concerns – Challenges

- Access implication in Lascanod and nearby due to conflicts.
- High demand for the Income generation (start-up funds) among survivors of GBV, C-care beneficiaries due the economic implications contributed by drought, conflict & climate changes.
- Insufficient Start-up Grants hinders the potential of their ventures and obstacles durability of the start-up.
- Domestic violence, force marriage & family abuse prevalence rate is increased (GBVIMS report) in eastern regions due to the economic pressure & social norms.
- Limited GBV/CP In emergency prevention campaign & as well as safe centers beyond major cities.
- Barriers entailed with the relocatedphase-out ICs from the Safe-House, incl. their safety, stigma, and living costs.

Priorities and areas of focus

- Expand WAAPO-Safe house in Cerigabo district and nearby Las,anood.
- Scale-up C-Care program in hard-to reach locations incl. Buhudle, Ainaba, Zialac & Baligubadle district.

- Scale-up Social-economic reintegration (livelihood) Through Upshift in Sool & Sanag region.
- Cash/voucher assistance support as mitigation for GBV/FGM and separation of children.
- Continuation of GBV/CP-in-Emergence prevention and responses program incl. Safe centres in hard-to reach & conflict district.
- Youth in climate changes efforts; Integrate Upshift and C-Care youth beneficiary for climate change efforts
- Strengthening MHPSS for the Safehouse drought effected communities
- Integrate Emergence response project (CP, SBC & GBV) mainstreaming with other sectors Wash/Nutrition/ Health and livelihood.
- Lift-up life skill and employability opportunities for the youth & victims of GBV affected by crises incl. children conflict with law, migrants, drought/climate change affected.
- Self-care for our frontline workers; and Zero – tolerance PSEA commitment prioritization

Brief Summary of Activities

- 1. Shelter Support (MHPSS, Material support and case management support)
- 2. Conduct Community engagement and outreach on GBV prevention and responses

With the support of UNFPA, This report highlights the main result, and progress for the implementation of the protection and support for GBV survivors in the Somaliland project, which is funded by UNFPA to WAAPO; for the period of 1, April – 30, December.2023

Project Achievements:

Activity 1: Shelter Support incl. MHPSS for the survivors of GBV and SGBV prevention sessions

WAAPO operates three Safe Houses in Somaliland that provide accommodation, three meals a day, child supplies, hygiene supplies, medical assistance, safe transportation to other services, mental health, and psychosocial support. Over the reporting period, a total of 38 women survivors, along with their children and other survivors, accessed Safe House support and other forms of assistance. Moreover, 80 survivors relocated from WAAPO Safe Houses, and Safe House residents were given hygiene kits.

Furthermore, during the reporting period, WAAPO's psychosocial workers and counsellors assisted a total of 167 survivors of GBV all of whom were female. These individuals had experienced psychosocial problems or showed signs and symptoms of traumatic depression and stress due to SGBV problems. WAAPO provided them with quality and ethical supportive services through the case management system, including group counselling, one-on-one counselling, and referrals. Through these efforts, WAAPO has demonstrated its commitment to providing holistic support to survivors of SGBV and creating safer communities for all.

During the reported period, WAAPO conducted three workshops in the IDP sites to connect the communities with the existing GBV services, such as safe house support and GBV case management, as well as services available to other GBV actors. The aim was to strengthen referral pathways & improve access to the available services. The workshops were attended by a total of 60 individuals, with 39 females and 21 males, and they were actively participating from three different regions, with 20 persons in each.

In addition, WAAPO has arranged 16 community engagements and outreach sessions on SGBV prevention and responses in six IDP sites located in Hargaisa, Borama, and Burco. The outreach sessions focused on various issues related to GBV mitigation, VAW, protection risks impacting women and girls during emergencies, and different forms of GBV, including traditional harmful practices like FGM/C and early marriage. The outreach sessions were successful in reaching out to a total of 516 individuals, comprising 334 females and 182 males..

Main concern and challenges

- Women and girls are exposed more risks on SGBV due to problems related to land ownership, constant evictions, lack of permanent / poor structured shelters in the displaced IDPs from droughts.
- Due to poor street lightening & lack of functional market squares in the newly IDPs sites from drought effected areas (women go afar distance for shopping), are subjected to both physical and sexual assaults.
- Intimate partner violence, domestic violence and family abuse prevalence rate is increased due to the economic pressure contributed by drought.
- Early/force marriage prevalence is also increased in eastern SL regions due to the droughts.
- Limited housing allowance for the SGBV survivors relocated from WAAPO Safe house to their family/community of origin.
- Relocated ICs from the Safe house particularly are faces stigma, discrimination, homeless, sever living condition problem.
- Lack of the material support, recreation activities and life skills program for the survivors of GBV in the Safe house and SGBV stop centers is also reported; and their prevalence is increasing Incl. the safe house & relocated cases

- Limited referral support assistance for the survivors of GBV in the eastern Somaliland region regions incl. <u>Sool</u>, <u>sanaag</u> and <u>Buhoodle</u> district as there is no safe house in <u>Sool</u> and <u>Sanaag</u> region.
- Safe house admission case load is increased due to the drought in <u>Togdheer</u> region despite the scarcity of safe house capacity.
- Primary prevention for the GBV mitigation incl. tradition harmful practice targeting IDPs and newly displaced communities is very limited particularly hard to reach locations.
- Female vulnerable adolescents incl. unwanted pregnancy and teen pregnancy at risk of protection concern needed unique services such reintegration with their peers, school transport and income generation activities.
- Gender sensitivity and mainstreaming in drought effected communities is also needed in drought effected communities to ensure women are taken resource, aid distribution and decision making.

ACTUAL PROGRESS ACHIEVED TOWARDS PLANNED RESULTS

With the project funded by UNHCR; WAAPO has been implemented SGBV prevention project that are targeted refugee and asylum seekers in Somaliland Under the Pillar-1; To ensure the participation of community in SGBV prevention & response enabled and sustained. During the reported period from Jan-December, 2023; under the pillar 1 (refugee & asylum seeker); WAAPO has been reached a total of 3722 Persons (F 2602 1120 M); and we have given protection service such safety and security (Safehouse) hygiene supplies, relocation support, referrals, PSS Case management, legal & medical vie referral as well as awareness-raising and education on GBV prevention & responses

To response GBV protection concerns has been raised due to the emergence sittings in Somaliland including Las, Anod conflict; WAAPO has extended its SGBV intervention program in drought and conflict areas and targeted most vulnerable women and girls in the IDPs; during the reported period from March – Jun, 2023; A total 14921 persons (F 9932; 4989 M)

Changes:

To strengthen GBV in emergencies, **WAAPO has been subjected amendment On March, 2023**; The amendment program are intended to provide protection services for the most vulnerable displaced individuals especially women and girls across three districts in 3 regions in Somaliland namely Togdheer (Burco), Sool (Laas Canood, Kalabaydh, Buuhudle), and Ceerigavo (Sanaag) with the goal of increasing access to multisectoral response service for the GBV to the conflict and drought-affected communities. This will be done by implementing the proposed interventions that identify protection risks for most vulnerable individuals, human rights violations, and service gaps related to GBV prevention and responses in conflict and drought-affected areas through risk assessments, protection monitoring, strengthened referral pathways, and implementation of protection activities related to GBV.

The proposed activities has been provided timely access to life saving interventions for the most vulnerable GBV survivors and those at risk of GBV, strengthen existing safe centres and frontline staff and establish/strengthen GBV stop desks.

2. Recommendation for amendments

For future amendment program on GBV program intervention we would like to suggest as per the below recommended GBV program intervention

- Enhance outreach programme as preventative measure to curb GBV particularly hard to reach locations.
- Initiate innovative approach to boost life skill and employability opportunities for the survivors of GBV affected by crise incl. migration, drought and climate change.
- Integrated PPA Programme Nexus Protection(GBV) main streaming with other sectors Wash/Nutrition/ Health and livelihood.
- In crisis like Las'Anod situation, women and girls are most likely to be affected more than the other community economically hence Social economic empowering programs for women and girls is needed.
- Develop and implement prevention strategies, including awareness-raising campaigns, community mobilization, and advocacy for policy and legal reforms led by the POCs vie IP.
- Conducting GBV assessments in the hard to reach location and conflict or drought occur, by including some resource during the emergences to inform GBV response planning and implementation.
- Strengthening GBV referral systems between MESAF, GBV actors, UNHCR and POCs by allocatin resource through IP in order strengthening referral pathways for GBV survivors. GBV actors work together to ensure that survivors receive comprehensive and timely support,
- Support WAAPO development and rsource for GBV response guidelines and protocols incl. Safe house policies, hotline SOPs and sensitize their staff
- Allocate resource to endorse and implement GBVIMS by providing IPs such tools, equipment, laptops, in the centers and officer located in the hard to reach location
- Sensitization for the PSEA both the CSOs staff, partners, POCs and imigartioin is also recommended.
